BC School Sports Team Sport Registration

It is the coaches' responsibility to ensure that their school is registered with BC School Sports (BCSS) and in Aquatics by the deadline specified by BCSS (October 3, 2018). Roster registration for each athlete must be completed in STARS by BCSS' deadline of October 17, 2018. Late registrations are assessed penalty fines by BCSS.

Zone Meet Entry Deadline: Friday, October 12, 2018

An online entry system is being developed to use this year, replacing the Excel workbook and Hytek. Late entries cannot be accepted.

Entry fees: \$30 per swimmer, maximum of 4 events, including relays & alternates.

Warm up

- Warm up lane assignments and times will be sent by email and posted at the meet
- Two warm up lanes will be available throughout the meet
- Coaches are to instruct their swimmers on how to enter the pool (no diving except in designated sprint lanes. Coach must be managing the lane).
- **Sprint Lanes** will open in Lanes 1 and 8 ten minutes before the close of each warm-up group.

Classification of Swimmer Categories

All swimmers are limited to a total of four events including alternate entries.
No time(s) recorded at this meet by SNC / SwimBC members may be used for Provincial or National Qualification or any Team selection since this is an unsanctioned event.

All swimmers must be correctly classified in the appropriate category or they will be disqualified in their individual events and relays. Please ensure your swimmers are honest about their swimming background. A complaint could result in a severe impact on the swimmer's school's results.

A Category

- ***New*** Any swimmer with an SNC number who has competed in a Winter Swim Meet as of September 1 of the previous year is classified as an A category swimmer.
- Swim academy athletes must participate in the A category only
- B swimmers can compete in any A Category due to no SNC sanction. No SNC number is required to swim in the A Category

B Category

- As of January 1st of the championship year, a B Category swimmer trains and competes from May 1st to Sept. 1st with no restrictions
- From Sept. 2nd to April 30th a B swimmer may train with their high school team and may participate in other speed swimming training such as winter maintenance, Triclub, private coaching. They may not compete in a Winter Swim Meet with an SNC number.
- Any swimmer in the A category who is registered in a B event will be disqualified from the Meet. This includes relay teams.
- B swimmers may swim in B or A category relays but may not swim in the same relay in both the A and B event. (Ex. 200 Free A Relay or 200 Free B Relay, but not both).

C Category (Vancouver Island only; not available at Provincials)

- Novice swimmers who have no experience with any swim club in the past may swim as C Category.
- Coaches: Enter C swimmers in the B events, and list them as C swimmers.
- At Regionals, C swimmers will be seeded and race with B swimmers; results will be separated for points purposes and put into a separate category. Ribbons are awarded for the C Category.
- In order to qualify for Provincials, C swimmers must place in the top 5 in the B event.

Para Category

- A documented Para swimmer can compete in any BCSS event with no classification or SNC number.
- The Para swimmer will be placed in order of finish by gender.

Championship Meet Rules

1. All competitors must be registered with BC School Sports and meet BCSS eligibility rules. Any swimmer who is not registered faces disqualification and/or school fines.
2. The meet will use the one start Rule, and the relay rules.
3. Competitors must wear only one swimsuit. For boys, the suit shall not extend above the navel or below the knee. For girls, the suit shall not cover the neck, nor extend past the shoulder, nor extend below the knee. All swim suits shall be made from textile materials and have no zippers. Tie-back suits are acceptable.
4. Each swimmer is limited to a total of 4 events. These events may be individual swims, relays or a combination. Listing as an alternate on a relay will count as one of the 4 events.
5. No time (NT) entries will NOT be allowed for seeding purposes. C swimmers will be seeded by entry times against B swimmers, therefore entry times are mandatory to ensure that they swim against swimmers with similar times. All swimmers must be entered with an entry time.
6. The meet will run cardless. There is no Marshalling. Coaches are responsible for getting swimmers to the blocks. Swimmers who miss their event will not be allowed to re-swim the event.
7. Start will be a series of short whistle blasts followed by a long whistle at which time the swimmers will mount the blocks. The Referee will signal the starter by an outstretched arm, following which the starter will instruct the swimmers to "take their marks" and will then cause a beep signal. The swimmers will start on the beep signal.
8. Swimmer's age must be included on their entry.
9. "A" category swimmers may not compete in B events.
10. "B" category swimmers may compete in "A" Category events (both individual and relay).

Relay Rules

11. Any swimmer who swims at the zone meet is eligible to swim on a relay at the Provincial meet even if they did not swim on that or any relay at the zone meet.
12. Mixed relay events must include 2 boys and 2 girls from the same school. Single gender schools are not permitted to combine for the purposes of creating a mixed relay.
13. No more than 2 teams for each school will be allowed to compete at Zones in each relay event.

Other Rules

14. All participants are to respect the facility rules, including proper disposal of garbage. Teams are expected to keep their respective areas clean, including at the conclusion of the meet. Parents are not permitted on deck unless volunteering. ALL photographers must have permission from Meet Management to be on deck. Flash photography is not be permitted at the start of each race. No glass containers on deck. Coaches and Volunteers please bring your own refillable water bottle. Water filling stations are available throughout the facility.

ENTRY INSTRUCTIONS

1. Complete your event entries in the new online system by **Friday, October 12, 2018**. A link will be sent by Monday, October 8th. This new online system will replace the need to download Hytek. Late entries cannot be accepted.
2. A psych sheet and fee report will be sent by e-mail on Monday October 15, 2018. Please review for any errors and advise of necessary corrections. Corrections and Scratches must be returned to vihighschoolswwimming@gmail.com prior to **Tuesday October 16, Noon**. Corrections are for **input errors only**, and are not intended for you to change swimmers' events once you have seen the psych sheet.
3. Once the meet is seeded, scratches will be taken, but the meet will NOT be reseeded.
4. Following the Zone meet **scratches** are due to the VI zone rep by **November 6, 2018, Noon, even if swimmers/relays are not in an advancing position.** This includes any alternates who will move into spots. Alternates will not be allowed after the scratch deadline. Remember, schools are responsible for payment to the Aquatic Commission for swimmers who scratch after the Provincial scratch deadline.
5. Zone reps will send all results to Provincial Entry Coordinator, including scratches until the Nov 7 Provincial scratch deadline and include any alternates that will move into the spots. Alternates will not be allowed after the scratch deadline. (email for entries will be sent to Zone Rep only). Zone Reps are responsible for ensuring athletes are notified if they qualify for Provincials due to scratches. This will be done by email to the athlete's coach prior to November 7. Provincial Entry Coordinator will *not* respond to requests from individual coaches. All communication must go through the Zone Rep.

TEAM REGISTRATION

The team's teacher sponsor or approved designate must check in with the Clerk of Course on the pool deck before Warm Ups. You will need to have the following for registration in order for your swimmers to participate at the Zone Championships.

- 1) Fee Report and Entries– this will reflect the Entries submitted by the Friday October 12, 2018 deadline – there will be no refunds for scratches.
- 2) Payment – Please make all cheques payable to School District 63 (Saanich).
- 3) Coach / Sponsor Contact Information Form (page 8 of this meet package)

SCRATCHES: Coaches must inform the Clerk of the Course of any scratched swimmers. Scratches will be accepted up to 30 minutes prior to the start of the meet (Deadline 10:30am). Deck entries and changes are not permitted.

SWIMMER SUPERVISION

Each team must be accompanied at all times by a teacher sponsor. If a sponsor teacher/coach is not accompanying the swimmer(s), a designated parent needs to have a letter from the school authorizing them to make decisions on behalf of the school (eg. DQ protests, etc). This requirement may also be fulfilled by the principal of a school sending a letter with another team, designating a teacher/ sponsor/chaperone from within the same school district as being responsible.

No teacher sponsor/coach/designated chaperone: No letter = No swimming !

Advancing to Provincial Championships

November 16 & 17, 2018, Richmond, BC - Watermania

The top 5 entries in each individual event qualify for the Provincial Championships.

The top 5 relay teams per relay event advance, with the EXCEPTION that only two relays from the same school per event may advance to Provincials.

AWARDS AND SCORING

RIBBONS: Individual events awarded to 8th place

Relay events awarded to 3rd place

Ribbons will be made available to school coaches or a designate at the end of the meet within 30 minutes if possible. Please pick up your school's ribbons before leaving the pool.
